Continuing in our decade of the America 250 Celebration

It is September 1775 and many Americans, including members of Congress, are hoping for a peaceful resolution to the current hostilities. However, the war escalated in Canada at Fort St. John and Montreal, while the British Navy harassed towns on the coast. Meanwhile, Patriot forces clashed with Loyalists in Virginia, North Carolina, and South Carolina. At the end of the month, rumors spread that Britain was hiring European mercenaries to send to America.

King George III refused to receive the Olive Branch Petition from the Continental Congress. The Olive Branch Petition was a final attempt by the Second Continental Congress in July 1775 to reconcile with Britain and avoid a full-scale war. Written largely by John Dickinson, it declared colonial loyalty to King George III while requesting an end to hostilities. The petition was rejected by the King, who soon declared the colonies in rebellion, which pushed Congress toward declaring independence.



September 2 — General George Washington chartered the 78-ton schooner, Hannah, out of Beverly, Massachusetts, under Captain Nicholas Broughton, to attack British transports and supply vessels off Boston Harbor. Some consider the Hannah to be the first warship in the American Navy.

September 11 — General Washington convened a Council of War to discuss the possibility of a direct attack upon Boston. After a lengthy discussion, the officers decided it was impractical to attack without artillery support.

September 19 (Philadelphia) — Congress appointed the Secret Committee of Congress, led by Thomas Willing and Robert Morris, to secretly conduct trade with foreign nations for military arms and supplies.

September 26 — In Boston, General Thomas Gage, disliked by his soldiers, who called him "Granny" due to lack of action, was relieved of command and ordered to return to Britain. General William Howe replaced him as Commander-in-Chief.

Upcoming events:


